A CALL TO DISCIPLESHIP:

Win, Word, Worship & Wonders (Act 2:38-47)

38 Then Peter said to them, "Repent, and let every one of you be baptised in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins; and you shall receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. 39 For the promise is to you and to your children, and to all who are afar off, as many as the Lord our God will call." 40 And with many other words he testified and exhorted them, saying, "Be saved from this perverse generation." 41 Then those who gladly received his word were baptized; and that day about three thousand souls were added to them. 42 And they continued steadfastly in the apostles' doctrine and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in prayers. 43 Then fear came upon every soul, and many wonders and signs were done through the apostles. 44 Now all who believed were together, and had all things in common, **45** and sold their possessions and goods, and divided[p] them among all, as anyone had need. 46 So continuing daily with one accord in the temple, and breaking bread from house to house, they ate their food with gladness and simplicity of heart, 47 praising God and having favour with all the people. And the Lord added to the church daily those who were being saved.

The call

Jesus called Peter to 'follow Him' on two occasions, the first time recorded in Luke 5: 10 and Mark 1:17, and the second call

in John 21:19 after Peter had denied Jesus three times. The call documented in the book of John repeats the same miracle, as in the first call, the catching of the fish after the men had been fishing all night having caught nothing, and then the repeat of the call from Jesus to Peter for him to 'follow Me.' In between these two calls that Peter received, he came face to face with the weakness of his own humanity, after declaring he would die for Jesus, '... if I have to die with You, I will not deny You ...'(Matthew 26: 35) to passionately denying that he ever knew Jesus on the night before Jesus is crucified. The call that is documented in John 21, was the Lord confirming His love for His disciple, Peter, even after the denial. Jesus knew when he first called Peter, that he would deny Him in his final hours before His crucifixion, however Peter did not know this, when he was first called. Jesus repeated the same miracle in the second call, as he did when he first called Peter, confirming that though Peter had fallen, Jesus knew he would fall when He first called him, but in the full knowledge of Peter's weakness, Jesus called Peter a second time to 'follow Him'.

The win

The imagery that Jesus employed when he used the miracle of the catching of the fish, both in the first and second call, was



used to convey that the call of the disciples was for the purpose of purporting the gospel and to win souls for the kingdom of heaven, from the kingdom of darkness to the kingdom of light. In the first catch, Jesus tells Peter to 'launch out into the deep and let down your nets for a catch,' (Luke 5:4). The catch of fish was so many that it caused the men's fish nets to break. Jesus declares to them that: 'from now on, you will catch men'(Luke 5: 8). In the second call, more detail is recorded in that the disciples catch one hundred and fifty-three large fish, (John 21: 11), however the nets did not break on this occasion. On the day of Pentecost, not long after Peter has been restored by Jesus, he is filled with the Holy Spirit and then used to preach the very first gospel message in which three thousand souls were baptised and added unto the church, (Acts 2: 41).

The word

As a young man, the psalmist David declared 'Your word I have hidden in my heart, that I might not sin against You', (Psalm 119:11). David knew the value of the word, that it would help to keep him in the will and the presence of the Lord. As a young man he had seen the presence of the Lord leave king Saul, and the effect this had on Saul's mental health. David continually asked the Lord, not to take His presence away from him, 'do not cast me away from Your Presence, and do not take your Holy Spirit from me'(Psalm 51:11). He knew that the word of the Lord would enlighten his understanding: (Psalm 119: 130) it would be a lamp to his feet, and a light to his path' (Psalm 119: 105).

Our minds will be in 'perfect peace' as we keep them stayed on the Lord (Isaiah 26: 3). Jesus as our ultimate mentor, led the example for us when our minds are under internal and external confrontation, in that he used the word to combat Satan as we see in Luke 4: 1-12, repeating the word back to Satan as a weapon, in His moment of temptation at the end of his forty day fast, as he launches into his ministry. Jesus repeats several times: 'it is written'.

The importance of the word as part of our spiritual armour is emphasised in Ephesians 6:17, 'and the sword of the Sprit, which is the word of God'. A sword is a dangerous weapon, you must be trained to use a sword to become a skilled swordsperson. Paul mentored a young man called Timothy and encouraged him to study, the word: 'be diligent to present yourself approved to God, a worker who does not need to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth', (2 Timothy 2:15). The importance of learning the word of God cannot be over emphasised, the foundational Shema prayer in Deuteronomy 6: 1-9 emphasises this importance and is a prayer recited by Jewish families every morning and evening:

6 "Now this is the commandment, and these are the statutes and judgments which the Lord your God has commanded to teach you, that you may observe them in the land which you are crossing over to possess, 2 that you may fear the Lord your God, to keep all His statutes and His commandments which I command you, you and your son and your grandson, all the days of your life, and that your days may be prolonged. 3 Therefore hear, O Israel, and be careful to observe it, that it may be well with you, and that you may multiply greatly as the Lord God of your fathers has promised you—'a land flowing with milk and honey.' 4 "Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God, the Lord is one! 5 You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your strength. 6 "And these words which I command you today shall be in your heart. 7 You shall teach them diligently to your children and shall talk of them when you sit in your house, when you walk by the way, when you lie down, and when you rise up. 8 You shall bind them as a sign on your hand, and they shall be as frontlets between your eyes. 9 You shall write them on the doorposts of your house and on your gates.

Jesus tells Peter to 'launch out into the deep and let down your nets for a catch,' (Luke 5:4).

A CALL TO DISCIPLESHIP (CONTINUED)

The cost of discipleship

In his book The Cost of Discipleship, Pastor Dietrich Bonhoeffer, speaks of 'cheap grace' versus 'costly grace'. He says that 'cheap grace is the deadly enemy of our church'. He defines cheap grace as 'the preaching of forgiveness without requiring repentance, baptism without church discipline, communion without confession ..., grace without discipleship, grace without the cross, grace without Jesus' He defines costly grace as: 'the treasure hidden in a field ...the pearl of great price ..., it calls us to follow ...]it is costly because it costs a man His life.'

A preacher noted recently: 'it is hard to be you, the discipline, the sacrifice, pressing against your offence, your flesh, and more, it is supposed to be hard, because you are more than what you think, if it is was easy, it wouldn't be you, it is hard to be you, it takes discipline to be you, it takes prayer to be you, it takes worship to be you it takes forgiveness to be you, it takes surrender to be you, it is hard, it is supposed to be hard, it is an upward journey.'

The cost of worship

In relation to the cost of worship, King David said to Araunah: '... no, but I will surely buy it from you for a price; nor will I offer to the Lord my God with that which costs me nothing ...', 2 Samuel 24: 24. David knew that worship had to cost him, he had to offer something of value to the Lord. In Romans 12:1 the Apostle Paul encourages us that presenting our 'bodies as a living sacrifice' is our 'true worship'. Paul emphasises metaphorically that he himself was pouring his own life out in service to the Lord, as a drink offering before the Lord (2 Timothy 4:6, 7, NKJV), 'For I am being poured out as a drink offering, and the time of my departure is at hand, I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith.'

The service of our lives that we offer to the Lord is clearly defined in the verses above as part of our worship, the cost of

our service, our time, our energy, our love for the Lord and His people, is a metaphoric drink offering that we pour out before the Lord.

The wonders

Many wonders are recorded in the Bible. The wonder of creation, the wonder of the Exodus from Egypt, the wonder of the birth of Jesus, the wonders of many people raised from the dead recorded in the old and new testaments. The word declares that particularly in the last days of time, the world as we know it is wearing out environmentally, in accordance with prophecy, and the Christian church waits for the second coming of Jesus, that there will be 'wonders in heaven above and signs in the earth beneath', Acts 2: 19, but though we will see and experience wonders, God is not known as the 'God of wonders', but He is known as the 'God of love'. A wonder was not known to convict or convert a soul, but it is through the love of God that people will be drawn to Him, into a life changing relationship, that can be the greatest wonder of all. For a person battling drug or alcohol abuse, domestic violence, and no peace in your mind or in your home, the greatest wonder is to experience the liberty that a life lived with Jesus can give, to know the Prince of Peace, who died for us to give us His peace, this is the greatest wonder of all.

John 14:27

Peace I leave with you, My peace I give to you; not as the world gives do I give to you. Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid.

Theme: Training to Fight (Proverbs 22:6 Thought: Under Pressure (Psalms 144:1)

Over months of prayers, plans and preparation by the Youth Disciples and young people, Friday 29th March 2024 saw the culmination of a beautiful thing. God truly inspired and provided guidance in the thoughts and ideas of the Disciples and young people who contributed.

The venue echoed the theme, Training to Fight, as scores of children, young people and adults arrived at a centre that specialised in boxing. With punch bags flanking the walls of the main auditorium, young people filed in for the start of worship after free registration and a welcoming continental breakfast. The Youth Disciples, Bishop Copeland and volunteers were there to meet and greet the many local young people for whom this was their first time in a church service – the fight had begun.

The faces of the children, youth and young adults was a beautiful sight. It was like looking over fields of beautiful flowers singing in the radiance of the sun. The Ipswich Praise Team filled the room with aromatic praise and the crowds of children and young people were taught how to praise and worship God. Before the praise session ended, all the children and young people were led marching around the auditorium, singing and marching to the songs of praise. The crescendo of united praise reached its peak when all the visiting children, young people and the young

saints in the house stood as a choir and sung praises to God Most High.

The Youth Disciple Team delivered a range of workshops to the various age groups: '0-4', '5-11', '12-17' & '18-25', whilst Bishop Copeland and Missionary Waugh led the 'adults' workshops.


This was the first year of having the 0-4 pre-school workshop which focused on training parents and grandparents how to instil the word of God in their babies and infants. There was play, singing and interactive learning from the adults with all the children. The workshop provided practical and enriching learning experiences for the parents, grandparents, and children alike.

The 5s-11s (Primary) were led into recognising the "stuff" that they are up against and learned ways to fight and win by faith, despite the plans of the enemy. They were highly engaged by jumping up to pull down pressures that were attached to helium balloons the room, undergirded with scriptures in the specific issues they are fighting against and with intermittent, energetic, and loud shouts of rejoicing.

The 12s-17s (Secondary) and the 18s-25s (Young Adults) were presented with real scenarios of the pressures that they and their peers face - those in the world and in the church. For instance. the impact of social media and the



entrapments of its immediate access through our smartphones and the seduction of surfing the web neglecting to spend time with God. Within their age groups they were challenged to think about how they would advise and support one another through the many vices and entrapments that they are socialised into. There was a shared understanding of how to develop self-discipline and the importance of giving peer support to overcome the multitude of pressures that they unconsciously face daily in today's society.







The adults' reflected on the range of pressures they faced as children and young adults and the expectations they had of their parents/carers. They were challenged to consider whether the challenges were the same or different to the ones children and young people are battling with today, and the expectations of them as adults in the minds and lives of today's young people trying to live a holy, Godly life in society. They shared lived experiences and understood the importance of engaging with children and young people to help and support them in their fight.

All of us were blessed with the feedback from each group, followed by more praise and worship.

The Word delivered by Elder Didier Stephen, from New Life Church, Newham, was punchy, upbeat, and very stimulating. There was vivid realism of the massive ongoing challenges faced by young people who want to live for God. Elder Didier shared from the word the powerful strategies that children and young people had access to. He affirmed that they have the power and authority to do great things for Christ, for they have the Holy Ghost living in them.


The children and young people were given the opportunity to exercise the power of God within them and were called up

to practice their faith in God by laying hands on Apostle C.N. McIntosh for his total healing. This was a great move of God.



The anointed altar call, presentations of the gifts and then worship in song, sharing and dancing from the children and young people brought a most excellent BCYM Youth Congress to its close. 
